He was born November 6, 1952 to the late Thomas & Leona (Sheaffer) Columbus. A gentle, reflective spirit, Joe often reminisced of childhood stories at Grandma's house and times with his siblings, Tom (Gerry), Susan (late), Jim, Allen, Tina and Bill.

He took pride in having kept the nuns busy along his path to graduation at Trinity High School. As an adult, Joe enlisted in the United States Air Force where he fondly told of his time serving in Alaska. There the beauty of nature surrounded him. When he returned to PA, Joe eventually settled into a career with the Navy Depot, Mechanicburg. However, his true calling in this life was being a loving and devoted father to his son, Nicholas.
