Barry A. Tienter, 71, of Roth Road, New Bloomfield, died late Wednesday, June 17, 2020 at his Centre Twp. home surrounded by his family.

Born December 7, 1948 in Annville, Lebanon County, PA, he was the son of the late Alvin A. and Almeda G. (Unger) Doutrich.

Barry graduated from the Masonic Homes Patton School for Boys in 1967. He was a patriot, and served his country in the United States Army as a military Policeman during the Vietnam War. After his discharge he became a Pennsylvania State Trooper and retired in 1995 after 25 years of service.

After retirement he continued to serve the community by serving on the board of directors for Perry Human Services. He enjoyed retirement, hunting, fishing, hiking woodcarving, and spending time with his family.
