Dennis “Tiny” Paul Haag, 78, of Loysville, Pennsylvania, passed away of natural causes on July 28, 2025.

He was born in Reading, Pennsylvania on August 27, 1946, to Quinton and Arlene Haag. Tiny attended Reading High School before making his curiosity and love of tinkering his profession by becoming a forklift technician.

Tiny subsequently met the love of his life, Jane, while she was attending Gettysburg College. The pair settled in Loysville, PA, remodeled a 200-year-old farmhouse and built a family with three sons, a sheep, and many pets.

His love of family and children drove his many years of community service including coaching little league baseball, volunteering for Pee-Wee football, becoming a Boy Scout Scoutmaster (while mentoring his three sons through their Eagle Scout rank), and working with numerous model rocketry groups (including 4-H). Tiny became an active member of Saint Bernard Catholic Church in New Bloomfield, PA.

Tiny will always be remembered for his ready laugh and willingness to volunteer for anything, even if he didn’t know how to do that for which he was volunteering.

Tiny was preceded in death by his son, Kyle Haag, and is survived by his wife Jane Haag, sons Kory Haag and Kristopher Haag, and grandchildren Callie Haag and Kadin Haag.

Services will be held on 8 August, 2025, at Saint Bernard Catholic Church in New Bloomfield, PA. Visitation hours will be from 10:00-11:00 followed by a

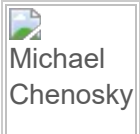

“ *Tiny was more than just a unit leader or Scoutmaster—he was the heart and soul of Scouting for many of us. His dedication went far beyond troop meetings. He was an active volunteer across the Council and played a vital role in supporting our Council Camps, especially Hidden Valley Scout Reservation.*

One of Tiny’s lasting legacies was his advocacy for staff housing at Hidden Valley, now known as Olweine Village. He had a forward-thinking vision for growing Scouting—blending new ideas with time-honored traditions. Tiny believed in adapting with the times, but never at the expense of our core values.

When you got to know Tiny, you quickly realized his true passion: the youth. His instrumental knowledge helped make the Rocketry Merit Badge a success year after year, impacting hundreds of Scouts who passed through Hidden Valley.

Even after a serious work accident, Tiny didn’t slow down. He would throw himself on the ground to get his hands dirty—changing oil on the backhoe, fixing tractors, or diagnosing equipment problems. Lock-tite may have been a product to most people, but in Tiny’s hands, it was the secret sauce that held camp equipment—and sometimes the camp itself—together.

I had the privilege of working alongside Tiny at summer camp and during the days before the Council merger that created the New Birth of Freedom Council. His waves, his smiles, and his willingness to share knowledge—whether it was about rocket science, small engine repair, or Hidden Valley history—will never be forgotten.

Tiny, thank you for always being just a phone call away, always around the corner—whether cutting your own grass or tinkering in your garage. Your legacy lives on in every Scout you helped guide.
