He and Jay had many special times, and he made life-long connections with friends who loved to do the same. He followed the Philadelphia sports teams, especially the Phillies. He made trips to watch them with family and friends. He loved to travel and did so across the US and internationally.

Emmanuel worked for the State of Pennsylvania; he was a cherished colleague who took on whatever responsibilities were necessary to help the

organization. He developed strong relationships with those that he worked for and with and was well respected for his diligence and hard work.
