Glenn H. Arnold, 81, of Newport went to his heavenly home on Saturday, October 7, 2023 in West Shore Hospital, Mechanicsburg.

Born July 7, 1942 in Allentown he was the son of the late Harry Emerson Arnold and Alma Sarah (Gerloach) Arnold.

Glenn was a registered land surveyor. He traveled all over the state in his work for the Pennsylvania Game Commission. After his retirement he continued surveying privately for 20 more years. He was also owner/operator of the Perry County Chimney Sweeps. He did all these things while farming and raising

his family. He was a patriot and a Vietnam era veteran who served his country in the United States Coast Guard. He loved the outdoors and enjoyed going to his camp in Elk County where he could watch the elk and visit with friends. His favorite things, in addition to his family, were Beekeeping, Traveling, surveying and farming.

Surviving is his wife of 56 years, Patricia Ann (Antler) Arnold. A son, Jacob H. Arnold and wife Carrie of Ohio. Twin grandsons, Luke and Brady and granddaughter, Zoe. A son-in-law, Randy Hershey and wife Donna of Quarryville and grandson Trent. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a son,

Clayton Arnold and a daughter, Rebecca H. Hershey.

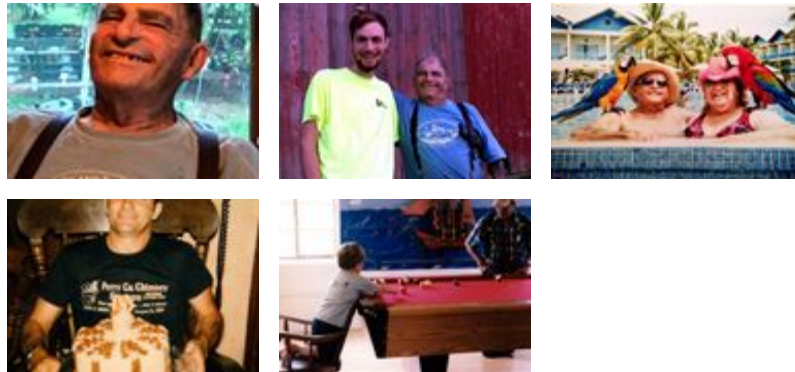
