Helene F. Stoak, from Duncannon, PA, passed away unexpectedly from Acute Leukemia on May 31, 2024, at 67 years of age. Helene was born on November 14, 1956, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana to Robert S. Friedman and Renee C. Friedman, who predeceased her. She was raised in Ann Arbor, MI and State College, PA.

Helene was the devoted and loving wife of James Stoak for nearly 22 years. They lived in Duncannon with their dog Belle, on whom she doted and who frequently appeared as a special guest on her work Zoom calls. Helene graduated from the University of Rochester in 1974 with a BA in Political Science. She most recently worked for Westat as a Field Supervisor for the National Health and Aging Study (NHATS). The NHATS is conducted by Westat of Rockville, MD on behalf of the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Helene loved her work and enjoyed her colleagues immensely where she supervised 16 data collectors.

Helene had a warm and generous spirit and a special gift of gab. She would strike up a conversation with virtually anyone, including people from her community and from the regions in which she traveled. Helene loved meeting people at the farmer's market, her local hair salon and new restaurants that she visited during her many travels.

Helene will be greatly missed by her family that adored her. In addition to her loving husband Jim, she is survived by her brother David Friedman and sister-in-law Carolyn of Arlington, VA. She was a devoted aunt to her nephew,

Matthew Friedman of Arlington, VA, and niece Jacqueline Friedman Hathaway (Cody) of Pittsburgh, PA. Helene was stepmother to Jessica DeVore (Justin) and recent Bubbie to Azalea.
