Mark was born to Paul and Lorraine (Kinch) Whitmoyer on May 14, 1950. In addition to his wife, Mark is survived by his sister Treva, brother Neil, and his two daughters, Jessi and Elli. He will also be lovingly remembered by his nephews, nieces, and cousins. His parents and his sister Nancy predecease him.

Mark was educated in community development at Penn State. His passion to make a difference was exemplified through his involvement in the West Perry School Board, HACC Board of Trustees, and the Perry County Democratic Committee. Through his business, Conservation Concepts, he sold and developed solar saving solutions, providing a livelihood for many employees

over nearly 40 years. He was active in the building of the Little Buffalo pavilion stage.

In his younger years, he played volleyball and made many social connections through that sport, including falling for his wife. Mark loved captaining the pontoon boat on the Susquehanna river and Keuka Lake.
