Polly A. Kitner, 73, of Shermans Dale, went home to be with her Lord and Savior on Tuesday, December 7, 2020, with her loving family by her side. Born April 7, 1947, she was the daughter of the late Gordon Jacob Weldon, Sr. and Grace Owen Weldon of Shermans Dale.

Polly is a true example of the Proverbs 31 noble woman. Proverbs 31: 10-31 NIV "A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of value. She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life. She selects wool and flax and works with eager hands. She is like the merchant ships, bringing her food from afar. She gets up while it is still dark; she provides food for her family and portions for her servant girls. She considers a field and buys it out of her earnings she plants a vineyard. She sets about her work vigorously; her arms are strong for her tasks. She sees that her trading is profitable, and her lamp does not go out at night. In her hand she holds the distaff and grasps the spindle with her fingers. She opens her arms to the poor and extends her

Polly did so much for so many. Her selflessness has been demonstrated even beyond her final breath on earth. Polly chose good over evil, peacemaker over conflict, and forgiveness over grudges. She cherished the time spent with family and friends, and was very devoted to Glenn E Kitner, her school sweetheart and husband of 52 short years.

She was in the first graduating class of West Perry High School and her desire to help people led to a Nursing degree from York School of Nursing in 1968. Polly served her community as a Registered Nurse in the ICU and recovery room at the former Carlisle Hospital, was a Visiting Nurse, an RN in the recovery room at Carlisle Surgery Center, and retiring as a RN at Memorial Eye Institute on the Linglestown Road. Through this long career, she has made life-long friendships that she cherished until her passing.

Polly was a charter member and served on the advisory board of the Hope of Glory Church in New Bloomfield. She was currently a member of the River of Life Community Church in New Bloomfield, PA.

She was preceded in death by her parents and in-laws: Harry and A. Beatrice 'Beaty' Kitner all of Shermans Dale.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by two children: Andy and wife Susan Kitner of Haslet, TX, Cindy and husband Robert Jay of Shermans Dale. Survived by four grandchildren: Emily Jay, Rachel Jay, Madison Kitner, and Reagan Kitner.
