



## Stanley R. Krammes

August 2, 1928 - June 2, 2022

Stanley R. Krammes, 93, of New Bloomfield entered into God's loving arms on Thursday June 2, 2022.

Known by many as Sarge, Whitey, or Pops, was born in Landingville to L. Stanley Krammes and Minnie Long Krammes August 2, 1928. He started working at the age of 12 in a local Colliery inspecting coal. He played football at Schuylkill Haven and was called the "Blonde Bomber". After graduation he served his country by joining the United States Navy. During his 2 years in the Navy, he was assigned to a DE called the USS Greenwood. His police career began with him being stationed in the first Perry County Police Station in New Bloomfield. During his time in New Bloomfield, he spotted an attractive brunette working in the local soda shop. A few years later he married that girl (Arlis Wohletz) and remained married for 68 years. Their marriage was a true love story.

Stan was stationed many places over his career in public service. He also trained for a year at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Va. After his retirement he worked in the US Marshalls office for 10 years. His last job was delivering flowers which he said was nice because were glad to see him as opposed to his police job. He loved his job as a police officer and would have done it all again. His stories were legendary with exceptional details. Family, friends, and faith were important to him. He enjoyed his Thursday trips to Dick's Hill Camp to play poker and have lunch with friends. He was a big Penn State Football fan. He enjoyed hunting with his son in law and grandsons in Potter County ,

Virginia, Idaho, and Montana. Fishing was another love...fly fishing with his good friend Ed Shenk...lake fishing with family and friends...saltwater fishing with friends in Fortescue, NJ.

Many thanks to all the Drs. Nurses, and physical therapists that cared for him. Your kindness was appreciated. Amy, he always said you were the best. Special thanks to Patty Arnold his friend and caregiver who loved and treated him like her own father.

He was a member of The Fraternal Order of Police, American Association of State Troopers,

Adams Masonic Lodge, New Bloomfield United Methodist Church, New Bloomfield Lions Club and Dick's Hill Hunting Camp.

He is survived by his wife of 68 years, Arlis, his daughter JoAnn Wilson and husband John of Shermans dale, Grandson Josh Wilson and wife Jessica of Shermans dale, grandson Jake Wilson and wife Melissa of Sunset Beach, NC, and 4 great grandsons, Gannon, Grant, Graham, and Blake. He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister Margaret, a half-brother Dale, and a great granddaughter Anna Mya.

Services will be held at 3 PM on Wednesday, June 8th at Boyer Family Funeral Home, New Bloomfield. There will be viewing from 1:00-3:00pm. Masonic services will be held at 2:45 PM just prior to the service. Rev. Patricia Wolaver will officiate. 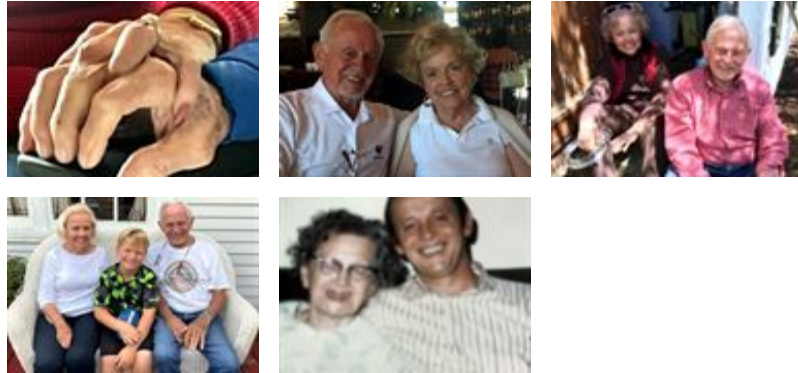
