Vonnie M. (McNaughton) Siegfried, 76, of Elliottsburg, Pennsylvania, passed away peacefully on the morning of Sunday, December 29, 2024, at Mercy House Hospice in Chambersburg.

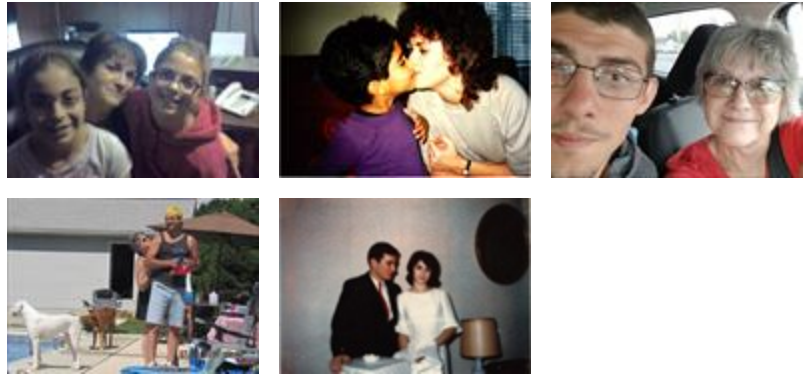
